Create a diverse coalition of engaged and motivated actors


(universities & research institutes, companies, clusters, associations, NGOs, regional development agencies, and government bodies)

What we did so far



- Started getting 'bottom-up' stakeholders in the process
 - Introductory meetings to establish interest and areas for cooperation
 - Structured interviews to determine knowledge transfer topics
 - Small group meetings with several stakeholders (e.g. demonstrating B2B tool)

- Tapped into existing structures, processes and initiatives
 - Working groups, technical committees
 - Clusters, business incubators
 - National initiatives for bioeconomy / circular economy



What we observed so far



- Still large focus on ministries (makes sense due to their mandate)
- Stakeholders wish to focus not only 'networking' but also content
- 'Chicken-and-egg' situation: Offer stakeholders something concrete but invite to co-create
- Existing structures = opportunity but also challenge!
- Reliant on country partners' level of commitment and proactiveness
